## COVID-19 UPDATE

### Recommencing aged care visits and excursions

You may be aware that the Queensland Health Minister has announced today that visitors will once again be allowed to enter aged care homes in Brisbane Metro South, from 01:00 am, Friday 25 September 2020. As with previous announcements, this is based on when the aged care facilities are ready to accept visitors.

We are pleased that the situation in Queensland has allowed for the restrictions to be lifted and we welcome family and loved ones being able to visit residents and also take them on excursions.

Anticipating this announcement, we have planned to have in place appropriate staffing and systems from tomorrow (Friday 25 September) to ensure that visits and excursions can occur as smoothly and safely as possible. From 9:00 am tomorrow we will recommence visits and excursions, subject to the same conditions that existed before the most recent lock-down came into effect.

### Practical considerations

Visits and excursions will need to be booked through the online booking system available through our website. Please remember:

- 1. Bookings for Friday 25 September.** The booking system is now open for visits and excursions. For tomorrow only, bookings can be made up to 4 hours in advance.
- 2. Bookings for Saturday 26 September.** The booking system is now open for excursions only this Saturday. Bookings need to be made at least 24 hours in advance. We will return to offering both visits and excursions from Saturday 3 October.
- 3. Other bookings - book at least 24 hours in advance using the online booking system.** Please use the booking system on our website to book visits or excursions. If you do not have access to the internet, perhaps a family member or friend could assist you (or at The Plains you can use the tablet that is available in the reception area to make your

booking). If these options are not available to you, our staff can make or change a booking for you. Please call Head Office (3737 5080) for assistance with booking.

4. **Arrive 5-10 minutes before your booked time, on the day you have booked.** Arriving a few minutes early will enable you to complete the sign-in process before being escorted into the aged care facility with other visitors who are booked for that time.
5. **Provide evidence of a current influenza vaccination if you are entering aged care.** It is a Queensland Government legal requirement that everyone who enters an aged care facility must provide evidence of a current influenza vaccination or medical exemption. Exemptions are not available based on conscientious, religious, or cultural objections to the influenza vaccination.
6. **Be patient and treat our staff with respect and courtesy.** Each visit or excursion is important to the resident, friends and families involved. However, it may take time to go through the required screening processes, and you may have to wait while staff attend to other residents, visitors, or tasks. Our lovely administration and care staff are trying to help.

We want everyone's experience of visits and excursions to be as smooth and enjoyable as possible. Our staff always seek to help people who are wanting to have a visit or excursion. However, to avoid a situation where you would need to be (regretfully!) turned away, please remember the requirements listed above.

### **Additional protective measures**

While we welcome visitors, we ask that you consider limiting your face-to-face visits to say once or twice a week and combine this with virtual visiting. This will help to reduce the number of visitors coming on site and the potential for exposure.

Also, if you will be visiting other aged care facilities, we ask that you wear a face mask during your visit. This will help to reduce cross infection within the aged care sector. These same measures are in place for our staff.

### **Changeable situation**

Our processes for visiting and excursions are in line with the *Industry Code for Visiting Residential Aged Care Homes During COVID-19* (the "Code"). The Code provides that operators of aged care facilities can implement stricter visiting arrangements to respond to changes in local conditions.

While in Queensland we are presently fortunate to be a situation where aged care facility visits and excursions can recommence, please remember that if the COVID situation in Queensland deteriorates we will need to implement tighter visiting and excursion arrangements. In such a

situation, tighter arrangements may need to be implemented very quickly and booked visits and excursions may need to be cancelled at short notice.

## **Conclusion**

I am thankful to God that at this time there are no known COVID infections among our residents or staff.

The welfare, health and safety of our residents and staff is our top priority. At all times, our decisions during the COVID-19 pandemic seek to faithfully achieve that priority.
